




FUN THINGS TO DO

1 Grab yourself an ordinary white party paper plate.




2 Fold it in half and cut 'pizza slices'. Be sure not to cut too far down, so you keep the brim of the hat intact.

A cheetah!





Queen of Hearts Strawberry Tarts



You will need:

150g (5oz) plain flour
Pinch of salt
75g (3oz) unsalted butter
3tbsp caster sugar
1 egg yolk
Cold water
Strawberry or raspberry jam

Mixing bowl
Rolling pin
Wooden spoon
Circular cutter
Heart shape cutter
Tart tin



Sift the flour and salt into your mixing bowl. Cut the butter into little cubes and put them in. Run your hands in cold water for a little while so you don't melt the butter. Dry them, then rub the butter & flour between your thumbs and fingers gently until it all looks like breadcrumbs.



Put in the caster sugar and egg yolk. Now with a wooden spoon, mix it together until it's stiff.



Add a little cold water, a tablespoon full at a time, to make it go together in a lump.



Dust your worktop with flour and knead the pastry gently for a few minutes then pop in the fridge for about 15 minutes.



Ask a grown up to preheat the oven to 190°C/375°F/gas mark 5.



Dust a little more flour onto your worktop and your rolling pin. Roll out the dough evenly to about 4mm thick.



Use your circular cutter to cut out the pastry and put them in the tart tin. Prick the bottom and sides of the pastry a few times and use a fork to make a pattern on the edges.



Put a tablespoon of jam into each tart.



Roll out leftover pastry and cut heart shapes to decorate the top of the tarts.



Ask a grown up to help you put the tarts in the oven for 20 minutes until beautifully golden brown.



The Yummy Bit! Ask your grown up to take them out of the oven and leave to cool. You must wait until they are cool before eating because cooked jam is very hot and you don't want to burn your mouth! When they are nice and cool, enjoy!



What a lazy Dormouse!



The Dormouse that lived in the teapot at the Mad Hatters tea party is famous for being so sleepy! But what are Dormice like in real life?

Well, funnily enough the word Dormouse comes from the French word 'dormir' - which means to sleep! 150 years ago, Dormice were widespread and even kept as pets. Unfortunately nowadays they are an endangered animal.

Very few people see them in the wild, only very lucky ones may see them in the South of England in woodland with plenty of scrub and undergrowth.

Their head and body are only about 70mm long, and their tail is about the same length. A grown up Dormouse only weighs as much as two £1 coins. In the wild they can live up to 5 years old, and they love nothing more than eating flowers, fruit, nuts and even insects.




What was school like 150 years ago?

Not many children even went to school! Instead they had to go to work to earn money for their family.


But if they did go to school, it was VERY strict. If you were naughty, you had to stand in the corner and wear a dunces hat. How embarrassing!

Although humans are the cause of most endangered wildlife, all of us can be part of making things right again. Some animals that were once nearly extinct are now thriving again thanks to conservationists.




You can help in small ways:









MAKE AN **ORIGAMI** WHITE RABBIT



1 You'll need a square piece of white paper (but you can use any colour if you like)




2 Fold the paper in half diagonally to make a triangle




3 Fold it in half again to make a smaller triangle




4 Unfold it again and turn so longest edge is at bottom




5 Now fold up along the long edge of the triangle as shown, so it looks like a hat




6 Then fold one bottom corner up next to the middle crease




7 Fold up the other side in the same way



8 Turn your rabbit over and fold down the top of the diamond shape down & inwards



9 Turn it over again and fold the bottom point upwards - so your rabbit will be able to stand up



To complete your rabbit simply stick on a pair of googly eyes and draw the nose and mouth with a felt tip.
